WHY?

- 1) Sports participants and numbers are declining. This coop would allow both schools to stay competitive or become more competitive for the future. It will also allow the Junior High and Junior Varsity programs to keep stable and become a better feeder program to the varsity team(s).
 - 2) Distance between the two schools is very realistic and reasonable.
 - 3) Could be the foundation for more than Sports coops. Both districts need to continue to share for both schools to maintain a successful future.
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NAME OF THE SPORTS COOP (Basketball, Volleyball, Track):

Option-

Both schools will keep their name. The name would be flipped with a coin being the most fair.

Ex. **Woonsocket/Sanborn Central** **WSC**
 Sanborn Central/Woonsocket **SCW**

MASCOT:

The coop includes both mascots which will allow both Schools to keep their mascot:

From the coin flip of the Name, the mascot will be flipped to reverse

Woonsocket/Sanborn Central **Rebels/Redmen**
 Sanborn Central/Woonsocket **Redmen/Rebels**

Or a new mascot could be voted on. One thing to remember is that it could be possible for Wessington Springs to join in the near future. We would not want to vote on something new and then a couple years down the road, it could be over with?

COLORS:

Option #1 (Use existing Uniforms)

One school would be designated home uniform and one the away. This would be no additional cost to both districts or at least in the beginning of the coop. Same thing for VB and Track.

Option #2 (Different uniforms)

The colors of the coop would remain as neutral as possible. The two main colors could be Black and White (maybe red and blue trim). Want the color to be neutral because of gym colors, etc. Uniform examples are included.

-Uniform Cost for Basketball:

Approx 15 Uniforms (30 Total for home and away

\$120-\$140=\$3600- \$4200 X 2 for Girls and/or Boys

-Uniform Cost for Volleyball:

\$75X 15 Uniforms (no home and away just one set) \$1125

-About the same for track also.

Roughly could get up to \$10,000 to \$12,000 for new uniforms all in one year. Option could be to rotate buying new uniforms so not all done in one year.

SCHOOL SONG:

Each School will keep their school song and school songs will be played at their respectable home games.....Rotate when possible on the road.

PARENT'S NIGHT:

Parent's night would be rotated each year. Example- Boys BB in Woonsocket and Girls BB in SC and rotate following year. VB rotates every other year.

CONFERENCE:

The coop would participate in the 281 and CBH Conferences:

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR:

Both Schools would utilize their A.D. for the coop. The A.D.'s will work together for scheduling/etc. Tim McCain will be the "Contact" AD for the Coop, but both AD's will be in charge of their own home games (Refs, Organization, etc.)

PRACTICES:

Both schools will have 50/50 practices for VB and GB/BB. Track participants would practice at the home site and meet up once a week to practice relays, etc., on a rotation basis.

(Note: The coaches will work with the A.D.'s for coordination of the practice schedule.)

GAMES:

Both schools will host 50/50 home games. The A.D.'s will work and coordinate the scheduling with home games for the interests of each school. The gate receipts will be taken and kept with the host school. The host school is responsible for the official's pay and mileage.

COACHES:

As long as both districts have coaches interested, we will not open the coaching positions to the public. As of right now, both AD's believe all coaching positions can be filled. Both schools will need a coach to transport kids to practices/games. (Note: Coaching staff will be small and save the districts some money, but transportation will use some of the savings.)

CHEERLEADERS: (If there is interest)

Each school would allow 4 cheerleaders for a total of 8 cheerleaders. Each school would run their own try-outs, etc. In case one school does not fill the roster of 4 cheerleaders, the other school can fill the rest of the total number of 8. Cheerleading advisors would be 50/50 between each school with all costs.

TRANSPORTATION:

Each school would run their own busing to practices/games/etc. AD's would divide bus driving between the two districts for games.

TRAINING & ELIGIBILITY RULES:

Training & eligibility rules will apply to what each school currently is doing. Both schools have similar training rules established and it would not be different for participants in each district.

OTHER EXPENSES:

All other expenses will be shared evenly between both schools.
Ex.- Awards, Basketballs, Volleyballs, standard equipment.

COOP AGREEMENT:

SDHSAA paper work should be completed by April 1st and the agreement is for two years.
